How can we develop a culture of prayer in our communities?

Prayer is both an activity and a way of living. Formal or informal, verbal or non-verbal, prayer is communication with God, which can be expressed in a variety of ways and take a variety of forms.

This two day program offers participants the chance to deepen an awareness of prayer and explore ways of engaging young people and adults in diverse experiences of prayer including Christian Meditation, contemplation and imaginative prayer techniques.

Day One will cover leading and guiding prayer and how to develop sacred spaces and a culture of prayer within your community that draws on our rich Catholic tradition in ways relevant to today's world.

Day Two will focus on a contemplative prayer walk that helps participants reflect and nurture their spirit whilst creatively bringing their learnings back to the specific needs and interests of their primary, secondary or parish community contexts.
